WALKING THE TRAIL

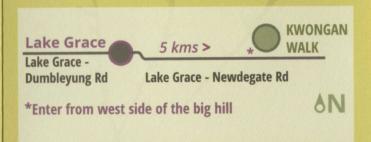


TRAIL CONDITIONS

- Gravel and/or sand, some uneven ground.
- Gentle slopes, one steep section.
- Trail may be slippery in places after rain.
- Trail partly follows a dual use road look both ways.
- Snakes live here too. Do not approach.

HELP TO PROTECT THIS PLACE

- No fires at any time.
- No camping.
- Picking wildflowers is illegal (\$2,000 fine).
- Drive and park only in allocated areas.
- Take your rubbish and food scraps with you.
- Respect wildlife observe from a distance.
- Keep your dog on leash and out of the bush.
 This area is regularly baited with poison.
- Stay on the trail so damage is limited.



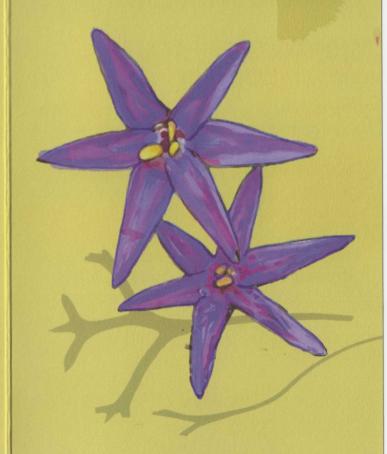

THE KWONGAN - HEATHLAND WALK

passes through a large bush reserve just 5 kilometres east of Lake Grace. A place of calm and beauty, the hilltop is a home for wildlife and a reminder of our natural history before broad-scale land clearing.

SLOW DOWN, TAKE A BREATH – AND A CLOSER LOOK

The trail will take you into the world of a Kwongan, or heath, and the special plants that live there. You will see a diverse range of species – from tiny orchids, sprawling banksias to sighing sheoaks – some only found in this district.

The trail is well marked and loops through 10 hectares of bush. You can walk the full track or just stroll along a section. Take your time and follow the interpretive signs to discover more about the heathland's fascinating flora.
