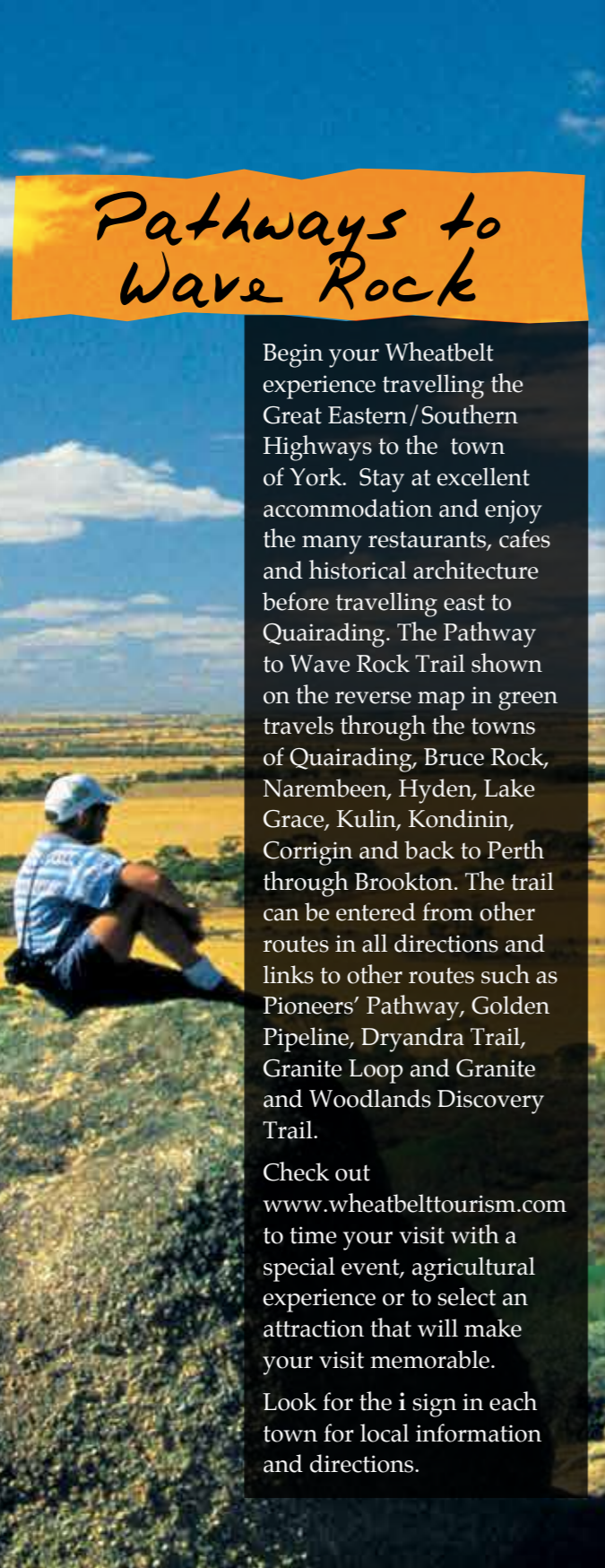
WELCOME!

The Central Wheatbelt is a wonder waiting to be enjoyed. Its massive granite outcrops and spectacular views are a haven for birds, wildlife and wildflowers that delight bushwalkers, wildflower enthusiasts and photographers.

Early explorers, such as John Septimus Roe, sandalwood cutters and early settlers all camped near these rocks where water and grasses were usually plentiful. Wheat fields, grazing sheep or cattle and magnificent stands of salmon gums, rough morrels and polished gimlets make the view after a climb to the summit worthwhile. The open space and night skies are awe inspiring

Glimpses of fauna or a beautiful flower on a bush at any time of the year, a picnic or BBQ at a tranquil picnic area or camping under the millions of stars, are simple delights of the area. Enjoy special delights of fresh produce such as olive oil, wines, preserves, yabbies and lavender products, excellent cafes and restaurants.

Friendly people in rural towns, each unique in some way, will welcome the traveller to a historic pub, motel, B&B, farmstay or shady caravan park.



Quairading

Large metal caricatures of the Grain Family welcome visitors to Quairading and delight children. The Vintage Working Farm Machinery, the Natural Wood Sculpture displays and a visit to Shenton Art Gallery make a visit to Quairading a must on your way to Wave Rock.

THE QAIRADING DISTRICT HERITAGE TRAIL B4 begins with a walk around Dangin with interpretive signs. A drive through surrounding farmland, using a brochure guide, visits sites of natural and historical significance such as Toapin Weir built in 1912. This is a fine example of a reticulated water system from a rock catchment.

GRANITE WAY D3 The granite outcrops of Mount Stirling and Kokerbin Rock are located 30kms east of Quairading. The area holds great significance for Aboriginal people. The beautiful views make a drive this way well worthwhile.

PINK LAKE C4 At certain times of year both sides of this lake 11 kms east of town have a distinctive pink colour.

QAIRADING NATURE RESERVE B4 This 527 hectare reserve west of the town has been set aside for flora and fauna conservation and environmental studies. Along its walk trails you may catch sight of a kangaroo or echidna and observe the wildflowers.

Corrigin

This grain and grazing town is nestled in the heart of the wheatbelt only 235km south east of Perth on the Brookton Highway. Corrigin has a rich agricultural heritage, the district produces around 171 thousand tonnes of wheat in an average year. It boasts a friendly atmosphere for both residents and visitors.

MAIN STREET & MISS B'S PARK Visit the shops and cafes in Campbell Street just off the Highway. Miss B's Park has picnic and BBQ facilities located in the main street.

DOG IN A UTE Corrigin still holds the world record for this famous event. In 2002, 1527 dogs in Utes participated and \$80,000 was raised for the Royal Flying Doctor & Community activities.

PIONEER MUSEUM & ROTARY PARK Stop for a BBQ or picnic in the shady park and then wander over to the museum. Open Sundays 2-5pm & Wednesdays 1-4pm or on request at 08 9063 2246.

DOG CEMETERY This cemetery began in 1974 as a tribute to 'Man's Best Friend', just 5km west of town.

WILDFLOWERS & WALK TRAILS A 4km Wildflower Drive starts at the Dog Cemetery. Over 200 species can be seen as it meanders through a wide range of soils, from sedgelands to mixed shrubs and various woodlands, some growing in profusion in broken rocks. Take a leisurely walk over the Corrigin Rock on the east edge of town and enjoy a picnic in the Adventure Playground.

LOOK-OUTS Panoramic views of the town and farmlands can be seen from the Anzac Memorial in town or from the Wildflower Drive.

GRANITE ROCKS George Rock - 20km east has camping and BBQ facilities. Sewell Rock is 40km SW and Wogelin Rock is 25km NW. Corrigin Rock is in the town which has BBQ facilities and playground.

Bruce Rock 'leads the way' to open spaces and an agricultural experience to be enjoyed by all. Friendly people welcome visitors to enjoy their picturesque main street, with it's gardens, the amphitheatre and sculpture park, historic buildings, museum, federation style verandahs and great facilities.

September to October the countryside abounds with colour. Enjoy a thirty minute Wildflower Drive through nature's natural canvas or try to find Babakin's underground orchid.

THE BUNKER F3 On the first weekend in November war veterans from all over Australia bring their caravans and tents to our caravan park and oval for a fabulous weekend of comradeship. The Bunker is run by our local Vietnam Veterans as an information and rest centre.

KOKERBIN ROCK D3 Reputedly the third biggest monolith in Australia this unspoilt granite outcrop in natural bushland has panoramic views from the top, bushwalking and picnic facilities.

SHACKLETON'S 'SMALLEST BANK IN AUSTRALIA' AND STEVE'S ART AND SCULPTURES D3 are unique features of a small settlement.

FEDERATION AMPHITHEATRE AND SCULPTURE PARK F3 Opened in 2001 with Australian Productions and International artists bringing the best on offer to the wheatbelt.

MEMORIAL AQUATIC CENTRE F3 is a modern facility with a slide, spa and river pool, BBQ and picnic facilities plus activity areas for sports. Situated near the Caravan Park, which has a campers' kitchen, backpacker huts, great facilities including a Easy-dump site and a skate park, this is an ideal place to spend some time.

BRUCE'S ROCK F3 2km from town is a quiet picnic spot in a shady area with historic wells.

WEST KULIN TIN HORSES E7 & F7 The tin horses on the western side of Kulin provide a fun introduction to the Bush Races and Tin Horse Highway.

SPECTACULAR WILDFLOWERS F8 Kulin's wonderful wildflower reserves, walk trails and roadsides put on a spectacular seasonal show of color. The town's floral emblem Eucalyptus macrocarpa can be viewed along the 1km Macrocarpa Walk Trail. [Best in Spring-Sept - Dec]

BUTLER'S GARAGE (KULIN MUSEUM) F8 Housed in one of Kulin's original buildings, the museum contains an impressive collection of vintage cars, farm equipment and machinery. Open Saturday mornings and by appointment.

GIANT WATER SLIDE AND AQUATIC CENTRE F8 Fill your summer days with fun on regional Australia's BIGGEST waterslide, located at the new Kulin Aquatic Centre. (Open during summer)

TIN HORSE HIGHWAY F8 This famous collection of clever community 'art' provides a seriously entertaining drive.

KULIN BUSH RACES G8 Indulge in spectacular scenery, rural hospitality, live entertainment, delicious food and horse racing! [Every October]

JILAKIN LAKE AND ROCK G8 Stop and admire the breathtaking views from the top of Jilakin Rock or enjoy a picnic under the most inland stand of Jarrah trees.

BUCKLEY'S BREAKAWAY I8 The perfect spot for a picnic and a photographers delight. This picturesque landform displays vibrant orange clays against spectacular white cliffs and gullies.

Located between Wave Rock and the Great Eastern Hwy Naremben is the perfect location to stop and relax while on your journey. The Naremben Heritage Walk, Art Deco Hall, Railway Goods Shed Mural and the three museums give visitors an insight into past and present in a typical wheatbelt town.

NAREMBEEN GRAINS DISCOVERY CENTRE A modern interpretive discovery centre focusing on the history and future of grain growing in WA, featuring amazing audio visual and interpretive displays of the grain growing industry "From Our Paddock to the World". Located adjacent to the Naremben Roadhouse. Open Monday to Sunday 9am - 5pm

OLD PROSPECTORS' TRAIL A theme based self drive tour with interpretive displays depicting life on trail used by prospectors and sandalwood cutters. A scenic and interesting drive with excellent brochure.

HIDDEN HOLLOW I4 A scenic trail leads you to a natural amphitheatre rock, great place for a picnic and spectacular wildflowers/orchids in spring.

ROE LOOKOUT F4 A scenic drive takes you to the top of this granite formation and a magnificent view of the district.

GATE 54 J4 100 years ago the Rabbit Proof Fence was built from Port Hedland to Ravensthorpe to keep animals out of the grain growing region and our section is still standing. Picnic facilities.

Kondinin, traversed in 1848 by Surveyor General J S Roe, was first settled in 1909. Preservation of a number of original buildings has enhanced the town centre. The Centenary Walk, a trail of mosaics, has been laid to commemorate past and present families, businesses and organisations and award winning iron sculptures have been incorporated. A great spot to break your journey.

HYDEN IS 'BUSH LIVING AT ITS BEST' I6 Rock formations, wildflowers, amazing stary nights, great facilities and friendly people makes your stay in this thriving town, close to Wave Rock, very enjoyable.

MULKA'S CAVE AND THE HUMPS J5 North of Hyden are rock formations with interesting folk lore, gnamma holes and water catchment structures.

TERRA VISTA - 'A VISIT TO TUSCANY' I5 in the wide open spaces of a wheat/sheep farm - an excellent restaurant with olive processing plant and olive oil products.

J.S.ROE HERITAGE TRAIL F7 Includes a mural of J.S.Roe's expedition of 1848-49, a replica well and picturesque Yeerakine Rock. The Heritage Trail of Bush Schools follows 6 sites and the Pioneer Cemetery is very interesting.

YEERAKINE ROCK WALK C7 Walk trail close to town with an old water catchment which is very interesting, and panoramic views.

KONDININ LAKE F7 a salt lake 5kms west of town covering over 1500 hectares . A delight for birdwatchers and nature lovers.

KARLIGARIN H6 is a 'small but proud' town that has retained its early settlement charm.

TRESSIE'S MUSEUM H6 is well worth a visit.

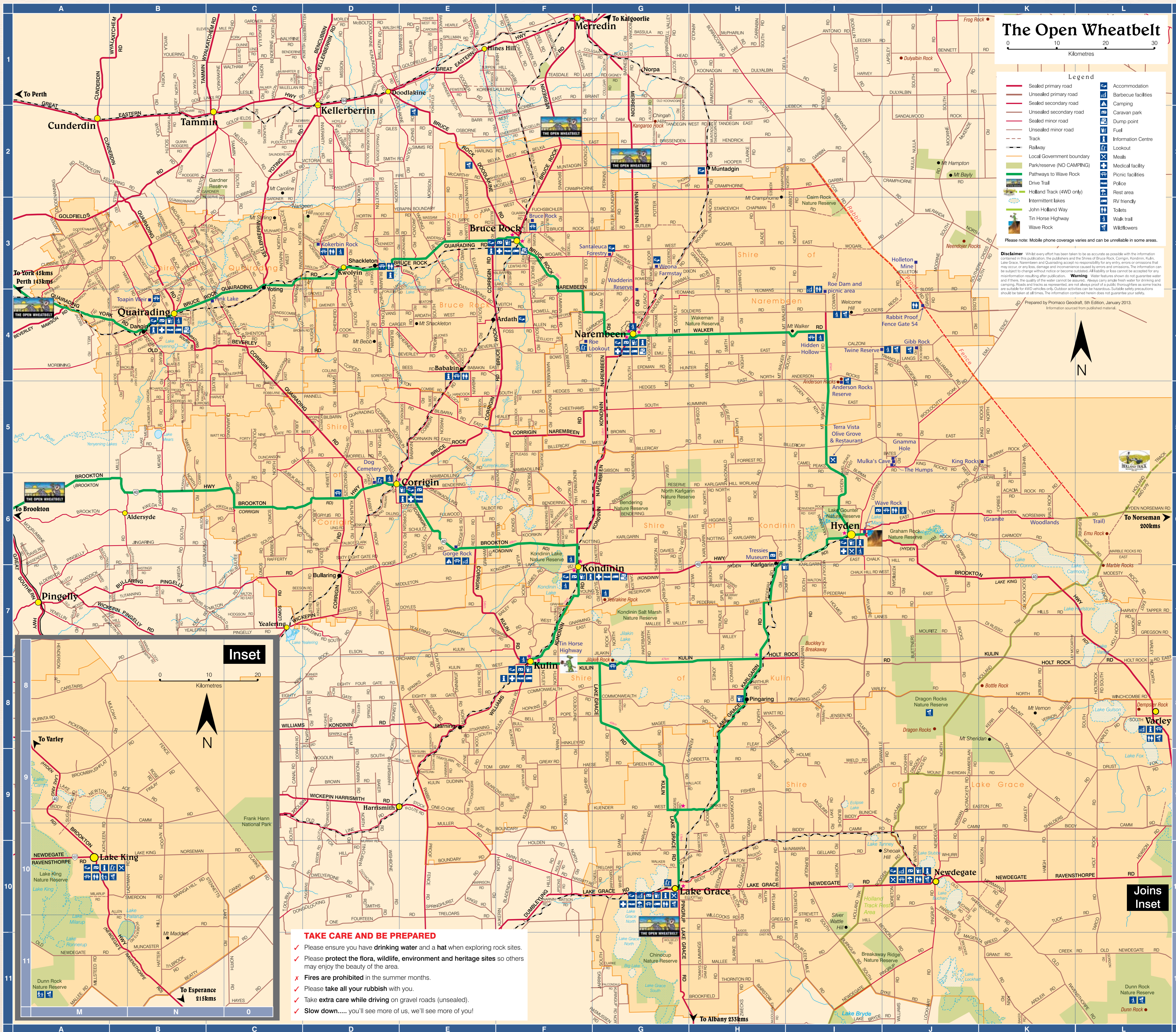
